



## Greater Cincinnati Leadership & Ethics Seminar

Welcome to the 12th annual Greater Cincinnati High School Leadership & Ethics Seminar – we are thrilled you're here to help us celebrate 12 years!

The purpose of this seminar is to provide you with an opportunity to better understand how to improve your leadership abilities by identifying and using your personal values to make ethically-based decisions under difficult circumstances. This is a key component of becoming a Leader of Character in your schools and communities. This seminar is the first part of a broader leadership development program in which you now have the opportunity to participate.

We have a fantastic speaker to kick us off - **Congressman Warren Davidson**. Warren Davidson represents Ohio's 8th Congressional District. Congressman Davidson enlisted in the Army as part of the 3rd Infantry Division, he was stationed in Germany and witnessed the fall of the Berlin Wall. Warren later received an appointment to the United States Military Academy at West Point where graduated near the top of his class as a student of American history and mechanical engineering. After the Army, Congressman Davidson earned an MBA from the University of Notre Dame, and spent fifteen years owning and operating manufacturing companies in Ohio. In 2016, he again responded to the call of service, and came to work in the U.S. House of Representatives. Congressman Davidson is excited to talk about leadership,

Today, you will have the opportunity to work in small groups with new participants as well as past participants and ROTC cadets from Xavier University who have been recognized for their leadership in their schools and communities. Each of these individuals will offer their perspective on how ethical leadership principles have helped them succeed.

We hope you get a lot out of the presentations and the discussions with your peers today, but we know that even a *great* one-day seminar is not enough to fully develop your ethical decision-making skills. It takes practice and reinforcement to make a difference. That is why we are continuing our mentoring program this year for seminar participants. Mentoring packet and instructions are available on our website to help continue your journey to become a capable and recognized leader.

We have established a competitive scholarship program eligible to all seminar attendees. These scholarships are independent of where you choose to attend college and are open to both sophomores and juniors. To qualify for these scholarships, you must 1) schedule and complete a mentoring program with a mentor of your choice, and 2) submit prompted essays in November. For the mentoring program, student participants will be asked to set up a one-hour meeting each month during the school year with their faculty mentor to continue the dialogue and training you receive today. Finalists will be asked to attend next year's seminar and be an assistant facilitator in the breakout groups that you will be part of today. So, pay attention today as you could help facilitate these groups next year!
